We will need help Saturday, June 3rd and Sunday, June 4th. Saturday we will be unpacking ordered plants, dividing or otherwise preparing some of the donations, labeling, and organizing everything for Sunday. We will start at 9:00 am and there will be donuts and coffee. The more people we have, the faster it goes. Usually we are done before noon. The best thing about volunteering Saturday is you get to see the plants first! Sunday is Sale day! We will start at 8:00 am (coffee and donuts again). Between 8:00 am and 9:00 am, we will be moving and organizing plants so shoppers can find what they want. We'll also be setting-up the checkout area and doing final preparations. CWGS members will be allowed to shop starting at 9:00 am. The general public will be allowed in starting at 10:00 am.

During the Sale, we need people to help with questions, plant selections, and anything else that comes up. It is really fun talking to all the people. The gamut runs from people starting their first pond or container garden to people with large water features and a lot of expertise. Don't feel you need to know everything about plants to help answer questions, if you get a question you don't know the answer to, there will be plenty of other people to ask and we will have reference books available as well. Sunday volunteers will also get lunch on CWGS. We will start to pack up at whatever point it seems like there isn't much left. We are usually done by 2:00 pm. Note: Due to changing guidelines from the Colorado Division of Parks and Wildlife, we will not be able to accept the following plants for donation: Yellow flag iris (Iris pseudacorus) listed on the Colorado Department of Agriculture Noxious Weeds Watch List, Parrotfeather (Myriophyllum aquaticum) listed as an Aquatic Nuisance Species, or Yellow Floating Heart (Nymphoides peltata) listed as an Aquatic Nuisance Species.

He will address water lilies full circle, 'It was Patrick Nutt and Longwood Gardens that moved my love of the water lilies forward in a quantum leap!' Anthony's water features are world-renowned! His plant knowledge, use in the landscape, and attention to detail is like no other.

Laura Bancroft, Ten Mile Creek Nursery. She is a nine-year experienced lotus grower with over 200 varieties. Her wealth of knowledge is an extension of her work in cooperation with The Lotus Project at Auburn University. She will be sharing her expertise on all things lotus.

Other things to look forward to at Longwood include: Sunrise at the Water Lily Pools, IWGS International Waterlily Competition and end the day with the Fountain Show.

Symposium destinations also include, **Terrain at Styer's** – Creativity on another level. Terrain is a wealth of design, style, and innovation in outdoor living. Garden related wares, rare plants, landscape services, gifts, and decor for the most discriminating taste.
