March 19th - Water Gardens of France with the International Waterlily & Water Gardening Society (IWGS)

In late August of 2019, CWGS board members Dorothy Martinez and Tamara Kilbane had the pleasure of attending the International Waterlily and Water Gardening Society (IWGS) Symposium in France.

Join us at our meeting on Thursday, March 19th in the Plant Society Building located within the Denver Botanic Gardens from 6:00 pm – 8:30 pm to hear about our adventures in the birthplace of hardy waterlily hybridizing!

Please join us for a Potluck from 6:00 pm – 7:00 pm. Bring your favorite salad, side dish, main dish, or dessert. Starting at 7:00 pm we will share photos taken during our visits to the Musée de l'Orangerie in Paris, home of eight large waterlily murals painted by Claude Monet; Giverny - home to Monet's home and gardens, including the waterlily pond that inspired his famous paintings; Latour-Marliac Nursery founded by Joseph Bory Latour-Marliac, the father of hardy waterlily hybridizing, in 1875 and still operational today; Jardins d'eau in Carsac-Aillac - a beautiful botanical garden filled with aquatic plants.

There will also be photos of some of the post Symposium activities in Nîmes, home of La Bamboueraie en Cévennes – a unique bamboo-based garden, Orange, Avignon, numerous Roman era structures, and Versailles - home of the famous Chateau and Gardens of King Louis XIV – the Sun King.

Please park in the Parking Garage located between York Street and Josephine Street and enter the Gardens through the Pinion Gate, located just North of the Visitor Center. DBG's Plant Society Building is located at the West end of the staff parking lot and drive. The building is immediately adjacent to the Bonsai Garden and Pavilion. From inside the pedestrian area of DBG, the Plant Society Building is reached by walking through the sliding gate at the end of the greenhouse structure and West Terrace.

Dividing, Planting, & Over Wintering Your Water Plants

One of our members, Kim Kimpton, conducted an informal survey last fall about what members of the Colorado Water Garden Society would like to know more about. We heard from numerous members that they want more information about the basics of water gardening.

Have you ever wondered how to divide water plants? How to plant them? What to plant them in (i.e. soil and containers)? What to do with them during the winter? Other questions about water gardening in general?

If you have asked yourself any of the questions above, this Seminar is for you. We will be holding a free Seminar at Hudson Gardens on Saturday, March 21st from 9:00 am – 12:00 pm to answer any questions you may have about dividing, planting, and the care of your various water plants. Hudson Gardens is located at 6115 S. Santa Fe Drive, Littleton, CO 80120.

Colorado Water Garden Society members and Hudson Gardens' volunteers will be available to demonstrate dividing and planting techniques. Meet us at the Water Garden Greenhouse beginning at 9:00 am. The Greenhouse is located just west of Monet's Place on the southwest portion of Hudson Gardens (see #18 on map below). We will have one or two people available from 9:00 am to 9:15 am to meet attendees in front of the Visitor Center as the Visitor Center does not open until 10:00 am. If you arrive after 9:15 am, please enter Hudson Gardens through the gate located just to the left (south) of the Visitor Center. We will also provide snacks and drinks.

This year's program will encompass the many different tropical marginals you can incorporate to give your pond a colorful and tropical mystique.

The Taro, an important part of Hawaiian culture and cuisine, will be featured. Tips on the planting, care, and over wintering of it and other tropical marginals, including Cannas, Papyrus, and Umbrella Plants, will be given.

The 2020 International Waterlily and Water Gardening Society (IWGS) Annual Symposium is in the planning stages, but it looks like there is some great stuff in the works. Each year the Symposium is in a different location with lots of new places to see, new lectures to hear, and new and old friends to catch up with. This year the Symposium will be held at the Naples Botanical Garden in Naples, Florida on July 29th through August 2nd.

The Naples Botanical Garden is a well-respected garden with great water gardens. It will be the center of the Symposium with lots of chances to explore the gardens and attend behind the scenes tours. Of course southern Florida has lots of other things to see. Just a few of the planned activities are a tour of the Everglades (alligators included), a tour of Big Cypress Bend Boardwalk, and a sunset cruise. There will be a trip up to Florida Aquatic Nurseries (where we get many of the plants for our Plant Sale), Fairchild Tropical Gardens, and Kampong Tropical Garden. There will be lectures on topics including lotus, aquascaping, and fertilizers.

Sound like a lot to fit into a few short days? Trust me, they keep the attendees moving the whole time. Wait there is more: all meals are included (you need to book the hotel separately). Also, no one goes hungry at a Symposium. There is also a daily Hospitality Room, open when we aren't doing other things, with light snacks, alcoholic, and non-alcoholic drinks for no additional charge.

There is a live and silent auction that usually has really fun and unusual stuff. Plants, art, books, hand sewn items, and many other interesting pieces that usually have some sort of water gardening theme.

Discontinuation of Printed Newsletters

For several years now, the Board has discussed if we should continue with printed Newsletters or only offer an electronic/digital Newsletter. We went with an option of digital or printed in March 2010. Approximately 65% of our members opted for the electronic Newsletter and 35% opted for the printed Newsletter. Now, approximately 80% of our members have opted for the electronic Newsletter and 20% have opted for the printed Newsletter.

In February 2018, the Board decided to change the fee structure for members receiving printed Newsletters, from \$15.00 to \$25.00 for Individual memberships and from \$20.00 to \$30.00 for Family memberships.

The cost to print our Newsletter has been our largest single expense for some time now. The cost of printer toner cartridges and postage has steadily increased. We are finding it harder and harder to get assistance with producing the Newsletter.

To simplify things, the Board has decided to no longer offer the option of a printed Newsletter starting in 2021. If you have chosen the option for a printed Newsletter, you will continue to receive a printed Newsletter through the end of 2020. After January 1, 2021, membership fees will remain at \$15.00 for Individual memberships and \$20.00 for Family memberships and all Newsletters will be sent out electronically.

We are also in the process of updating and changing the format of our website. This should simplify access to the electronic Newsletter, make finding meetings/events, educational brochures, information, and advertisers much easier. We hope to have the new, updated Website up and running by May or June of 2020. We will also be adding an option to pay for memberships electronically through an application like Paypal or Venmo.
