Now that the gardening season is drawing to a close, are you considering what went well and starting to plan for next year? The Colorado Water Garden Society is the place for meeting both experienced and new gardeners as well as providing an online resource for information you may need. You can access the website at https://www.colowatergardensociety.org/.

Membership is \$15 for an individual and \$20 for a family. There is an easy link on the website for you to renew your membership or join for the first time (https://www.colowatergardensociety.org/SignUp.cfm?o=o?CategoryID=115). Dues are effective from January to December. A change this year allows all returning members to have these same dates.

CWGS provides almost monthly opportunities to visit with other gardeners. Member's evening meetings are usually held in March, September, and October with expert presentations on growing various plants or gardening techniques.

April brings the spring highlight event, Get Wet! Gardeners look forward to this evening and consider it to be the beginning of the season. In past years, we have sold dormant lotus tubers or canna rhizomes.

The annual member's Plant Swap takes place in May. This is an opportunity to learn about someone else's favorite plants and get a start for something new in your garden. This year it was held in Northglenn and will be hopefully held in the southern part of the city in 2023.

The CWGS annual Plant Sale takes place at Hudson Gardens the first weekend of June. Members enjoy shopping the first hour before the general public and have first choice of a huge variety of water lilies and lotus, plus a large variety of tropical and hardy bog plants.

The annual Pond Tour and Picnic is scheduled for mid-July. This year about 40 people enjoyed individual tours of wonderful gardens and the Picnic.

Pondside meetings take place in June and August at various businesses active in water gardening or at individual member's ponds.

The December Holiday Party is filled with good food and lots of laughter including a small gift exchange.
