Denver Botanic Gardens 2021 Virtual Plant Sale

Denver Botanic Gardens will hold its spring plant sale online again this year beginning on April 27th at 10:00 am and ending at 4:00pm on April 29th. The preview sale is sold out due to high demand. Plant orders will be available for pick-up curbside from May 6th through May 9th on the top deck of the parking structure at the York Street location. A "leftovers" sale will be held for in person shopping for any remaining plants on May 10th and 11th.

The Aquatics division of the sale is offering an array of marginal plants again this year including Canna, Taro, Iris, Pickerel Plant, and many more varieties! Below is a list of the aquatic plants that will be for sale. Here is a link to a complete list of all the plants being offered for sale:

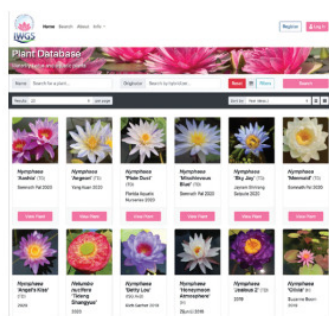

We may not have as many participants as in year's past, but we have participants! We have tentatively scheduled Saturday, July 17th for this year's Pond Tour.

More good news, we are also proceeding with plans to reserve a park shelter for the Annual Pond Tour Picnic that takes place after the Pond Tour. The difference this year will be all Picnic attendees will be expected to bring their own food/beverages for themselves and any of their guests. For this year's Picnic, CWGS will not be providing food or beverages.

IWGS Plant Database, All New Searchable Listings

We are pleased to announce the launch of the new IWGS Plant Database. This is fully searchable, by plant or hybridizer, with advanced filters to help you find that next plant for your pond - or help identify a plant you may already have.

It is two years since the launch of the first IWGS plant database, and while a major milestone at that time it was not without its problems, the complexities of integrating a custom database into our existing website proved to be difficult and limiting. Each upgrade to the website could cause problems with the functionality of the database.

So, following discussions during our 2019 symposium in France and with new committee member Sander Dekker volunteering to help with development, we started from the ground up to create a new user interface on a different platform. The cost of the services required to run the database on this new platform have been covered through to 2030 thanks to a grant provided by Microsoft.

What's new?

The basic search function allows you to find plants by plant name and/or hybridizer. With the advanced filters you can search for plants with characteristics such as flower color, species only, award winning plants, registered plants, or plants originating from a particular year. Together these search and filter tools can help you find that next plant for your pond - or help identify a plant you may already have.

We have also referenced plants from the Victoria Adventure <http://www.victoria-adventure.org> and Plants of the World online <http://www.plantsoftheworldonline.org> websites, and plant information listed from these sources has been appropriately credited under the source citation for each plant.

At the time of writing, we have 3,247 plant names and more than 1,371 photos of waterlily and lotus varieties. Our next update will include shallow water, submerged, and floating plants, to create your number one source for ALL aquatic plants!

Get involved!

Help us make it even better! Another new feature is the ability for you to upload your own photos to share with the world using the Photo Upload button available on each plant page. To use this feature, you will first need to register, which is easy, and can also be done through Microsoft, Google, or Facebook logins (please note login details for the Plant Database are different to your IWGS login). Once you have submitted your photo it will need to be verified by the committee before it will appear on the database, so please be patient if you do not see it straight away.

In the first week of the launch of the new Plant Database we received 500 unique visitors, 6,100 views, over 40 newly registered users and more than 250 new photos within the first 72 hours!

There is no completion date for this type of project, as new information becomes available it will be added, and we will continue to develop new tools and features over the coming months and years.
